

ABSTRACTS

Dr. Marx is the typical representative of the Historical Materialism. Dr. Marx is sure about the human creativity; however, the full manifestation of this kind of creativity can only occur outside the range of the property and the capitalism. Superficially, the Historical Materialism does not pay enough attention to the property system. When the researchers go into the question concerning the Intellectual Property Rights, they can hardly relate it with the Historical Materialism. The primary difficulties are as follows: firstly, Marx analyzes the abstract property from the perspective of jurisprudence instead of the philosophy of law; secondly, the main research subject of Marx is the production of material goods, and Marx does not really touch on the abstract object of productivity. Virtually, the Historical Materialism does have something to do with the Intellectual Property Rights; on the contrary, the purpose of the conceptual framework of Marxism shall prove to be significant for the grasp and understanding of the status of property in the society and the relation between the Intellectual Property Rights and the economy.
